DO NOT BE AFRAID TO ASK ANYTHING

Not sure about deadlines or eligibility? Don't be afraid to email or call the organization about it.

ORGANIZE YOUR APPLICATIONS

Keep everything relevant to scholarships in a single file or place for convenience. You will often use the same information for various applications.

DO NOT LET REJECTION BRING YOU DOWN

Getting rejection letters is difficult to hear. Do not take it personal as it means nothing to your competence. Due to high scholarship applicants, committees will not even look at half of them.

CONTACT YOUR RECOMMENDERS EARLY

Asking your recommenders ahead of time is not only respectful, but also ensure you will get a quality letter instead of a regular one.

FOR UNDOCUMENTED STUDENTS

Again, not sure of eligibility? Emailing them will for clarity is important, and they cannot use information against you. If you feel unsure or need more support, connect with one of our specialists to advocate for you.

YES, EVEN THE SMALL SCHOLARSHIPS MATTER

Scholarship money adds up quick, so apply for small scholarships even if it seems frustrating.
